Whether you join as a standard member or upgrade to an elite membership, we look forward to advancing this dynamic industry with you.



Tennessee is a national leader in bioscience-related distribution, a specialized
employment concentration. The average wage in the industry was \$109,979—69
percent higher than the private sector average.

TENNESSEE

A leader in bioscience R&D

According to a recent report from TEConomy, Tennessee has emerged as a leading state for bioscience research and development, with bioscience R&D accounting for 74 percent of all research in the state.

Specifically, bioscience-related academic R&D spending totaled nearly \$1.2 billion in Tennessee, which is more than 10 points higher than the national average and ranks the Volunteer State among the top quintile of states in the U.S.



REGIONAL STRENGTHS

Memphis

Bluff City remains a strong market, landing in the top 20 U.S. metro markets for its specializations of devices as well as bio-agriculture and industrial biosciences.

Nashville

Dubbed the “Health Care Capital”, Nashville is a large MSA that specializes in bioscience-related distribution. The city also has strong venture capitalist investment in bio-based products and biofuels.

Knoxville

Knoxville is recognized as a leading large metro with significant employment in Research, Testing, and Medical Laboratories, accounting for nearly 7,000 employees in the MSA.

Johnson City

Johnson City is noted as a small MSA with a specialization in Research, Testing, and Medical Laboratories.







POLICY PRINCIPLES

Life Science Tennessee advocates for state and national policies that help build our industry in Tennessee and expand our reach across the world.

We work closely with the Life Science Caucus, which formed in 2018 and is made up of Tennessee state legislators, and retain a full-time lobbyist to identify important issues and help communicate our positions to policymakers.

Guiding policy principles include:

- Support Tennessee's innovation economy, including funding for research and new technologies
- Preserve intellectual property and patent protections
- Advance programs to strengthen talent recruitment, workforce development, and STEM education
- Recognize the value of medicine in treating disease and bringing cures and new therapies to patients

ADVOCACY EVENTS

Day on the Hill | Feb. 24

During the Tennessee Legislative session, Life Science Tennessee members, Tennessee-based students and researchers, and industry executives from across the state come to Nashville for a day-long advocacy event. During our Day on the Hill, our members and stakeholders meet with Tennessee state lawmakers to discuss how we can better support our companies, research institutions, teachers, and entrepreneurs and continue to grow our bioscience economy.

Day in DC | March 5

Life Science Tennessee's Day in DC is a chance for Life Science Tennessee members to meet federal policymakers in our nation's Capitol. This two-day event includes meetings with Tennessee's congressional delegation, a reception for Tennessee staff members, and a policy briefing.

LSTCON


November 5 | Nashville

Educational Webinars

Life Science Tennessee develops several educational webinars and meetings on a yearly basis to provide a platform for interested life science professionals to learn about industry trends, complex policy efforts, and resources available to Tennessee based companies.

Life Science Tennessee Foundation partners with Life Science Tennessee and Launch Tennessee to build and grow innovative life science companies and jobs in Tennessee. Co-founded by serial life science entrepreneurs, the Foundation is focused on the critical areas of entrepreneurship, access to capital, education and workforce development to help Tennessee grow into a major hub of research and development that will improve the lives of Tennesseans, as well as those that benefit from Tennessee products around the world. 

STEM REPORTS


